STAY SAFE—SOCIAL DISTANCING

Social distancing remains compulsory for all.

- ◆ Stay 2 metres (6ft) away from other people
- Wash your hands often and for 20 seconds

When we reduce our day-to-day contact with other people, we will reduce the spread of the infection. That is why it's really important to continue to follow good social distancing habits.

You and your visitors must observe the advice to remain at least 2 metres apart from others (excluding members of your own household).

Update 18 May 2020: Outdoor gatherings of up to 10 people will be permitted **from the morning of Wednesday 20 May**, with social distancing being observed at all times between those from different households. Up to two people will also be able to visit you inside your home . The guidance recommends that indoor contact is limited to 15 minutes and social distancing must be observed.

RECYCLING

REPAIRS

We want to continue to offer a safe and effective repairs service, however we also need to protect our residents and staff by minimising non-essential contact. This means we will continue to carry out emergency repairs, urgent works of a health and safety nature and compliance works.

Please note that we will need to ask you a set of pre-screening questions before starting any works and before entering your home. Please do not be offended by this, our staff and resident's health is important to us.

We will consider external works and occupational therapy requests to properties subject to risk assessments, method statements and being of a low enough risk and safety.

All property inspections and non-essential visits have been postponed until further notice.

MAINTENANCE

Gas Safety Checks

As landlords we have a legal duty to repair and maintain gas pipework, flues and appliances. Gas safety checks should be continued until the government changes their guidance. Where possible we are working to bring forward these checks but appreciate that this may be difficult at this time due to access.

Fire Alarm Systems Maintenance

As landlords have a legal duty to carry out regular checks and tests to Fire detection equipment, Weekly and Annual Fire alarm testing should be continued until the government changes their guidance. If access is required to your flat we will contact you before, should you wish to discuss this further please contact this office.

EMERGENCY REPAIRS

To report an emergency repair,

- No electricity
- Gas leak
- No cold, clean drinking water or dirty water coming up through plug holes or toilets
- A severe leak and/or burst pipe
- Any leak that is affecting the electrics

VISITING THE ELDERLY





Older people, over the age of 70, continue to be at significant risk of severe disease if they get COVID-19.

Whether they are living in the community or in residential care, older people are still advised to self-isolate as far as possible to avoid coming into contact with the virus. Care homes have significant restrictions on visiting to protect their vulnerable residents.

To continue to protect older people as we move to 'Stay Safe', the <u>recommendations on self-isolation</u> (at home or in a care home) remain in place.

People are encouraged to stay in touch with older relatives and friends through phone and video calls wherever possible. It is still possible to have a face to face conversation with your loved one so long as you do not enter their home and you can maintain a 2 metre distance from them.

You can do this, for example, by visiting at a prearranged time and talking to them while they are at a window or doorstep and you are 2 metres away in the garden or on the street. You were able to do this in the 'Stay Home' phase, but only if your loved one lived close by. Now, it will be OK to drive to where they live to talk to them as described above.

It may not be possible to talk from street level to relatives or friends who live, for example, in an upper floor flat or upper floor of a care home but journeys for the purpose of waving to or phoning them while they can see you in the street/garden below will now be ok.
